

Article 1.1: Definition and Status

These Additional Supplementary Regulations (ASRs) must be read in conjunction with the 2023 HERO Standard Regulations (HSRs). The article numbers are those of the HSRs. Competitors must study the HSRs as well as these ASRs. (Note: Any additional amendments to the HSRs or these ASRs will be advised in Bulletin 1)

The Scottish Malts will be run by HERO-ERA under a Clubman Historic Road Rally Permit (no. TBA) issued by Motorsport UK and is open only to members of the promoting club in compliance with the Regulations of Motorsport UK in compliance with the FIVA International Sport Code; the HSRs; these ASRs; and further Bulletins for the event, which may amend these ASRs and the HSRs.

IMPORTANT NOTE: All motor sport is potentially dangerous. The onus is on competitors to drive carefully and safely at all times. The Organisers accept no responsibility whatsoever for any accident or injury befalling competitors, and do not undertake to provide rescue or assistance of any kind. All competitors will be required to sign the indemnity at Signing On.

Article 3: Eligible Vehicles

Please note that in some cases it will be necessary for us to apply for waivers if your car is registered after 1st January 1968.

In order that we may apply for the waivers on your behalf, could you please supply the following information:

- Three photos one general exterior view, one internal view and one of the engine bay.
- A copy of the vehicle registration document. If your vehicle has been imported it will be necessary for you to provide a copy of documentation that confirms the original build date of the car.

Once we have received the above, we will be able to confirm whether or not additional photos or other information is required before we are able to process the application for waivers.

Article 3.2: Classes

Competing vehicles will be divided into four categories. These categories may then be split into classes to provide the best competition between crews and may include criteria for body style, cubic capacity and design age.

The provisional list of category and classes is as follows:

Category 1 – Cars of a specification valid before 1st January 1968

Category 2 – Cars of a specification valid between 1st January 1968 and 31st December 1974

Category 3 – Cars of a specification valid between 1st January 1975 and 31st December 1981

Category 4(a) – Cars of a specification valid between 1st January 1982 and 31st December 1985

Categories may be merged if there are insufficient cars entered in any one category or class.

Cars in Categories 3 and 4(a) are not eligible for overall awards.

All vehicles must be taxed and insured for the public highway. They must further comply with Motorsport UK Technical Regulations and in particular with J5 and R19.1.

Article 5.2 - Eligible Competitors - Licences

For UK Residents - As for all events run in the UK by HERO-ERA in 2023 and beyond, all competitors whether you're a driver or a navigator are required to have a Current Motorsport UK Competition licence (or a Competition Licence issued by your country's governing body). If you don't hold such a licence then you must apply for an RS Clubman licence. This licence is free of charge and can be obtained by going online to the Motorsport UK site and making a formal application. If you held a 2022 Licence you will need to renew it for 2023.

You will then be issued with a competition licence which will give you your competition licence number. You will also need to bring the competition licence with you for inspection at signing on or if you have a temporary number please bring the email confirmation.

Should you require any assistance regarding this, then please do not hesitate to contact the office who will give you any guidance they can.

For Non-UK Residents – Any Non-UK resident that does not hold a competition licence issued by the motorsport governing body of their native country can apply for a Motorsport UK RS Clubman licence. This exercise must be completed before the event so that competitors can bring the UK licence to the start venue.

For non-UK applicants, there are a few things to note when completing the registration process:

- 1. When prompted for a telephone number please use the HERO-ERA number: 01869 254979
- 2. When asked for an email address, please use your own email address as all communication will be via email
- 3. When asked for an address, please enter the HERO-ERA address of: 138 Southern Avenue, Bicester Heritage, Bicester, OX27 8FY

This will allow you to proceed, all correspondence will be sent to your email address so that is the critical part of the application to be completed.

Article 6.1: Entry Applications

Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis to those competitors who have completed the entry form in full and paid the deposit. If full payment isn't received by the closing date then the place will be offered to the first reserve on the waiting list.

All participants must be a minimum of a HERO-ERA Club member, applications can be made to the membership team.

The closing date for entries is Monday April 10th 2023.

Article 6.2: Maximum and Minimum Number of Entries

The maximum number of entries allowed to take part will be 60, the minimum will be 20.

Article 7.1: Entry Fees

The entry fee includes:

- Event participation for one eligible car with a crew of two Driver & Navigator
- Detailed Tulip Road Book and/or other Route Instructions
- Choice of official Scottish Malts merchandise or HERO-ERA store voucher

- Extensive Hospitality package:
 - Six nights' accommodation, including breakfast, Sunday 23rd April through to Friday 28th April (crew of two sharing a double or twin room). Single room supplements subject to availability.
 - Welcome dinner on Sunday 23rd April including house wine with meal.
 - o Drinks reception & Awards presentation Black Tie banquet on Friday 28th April.
 - Lunch for each crew member, on each of the five days of competition, Monday 24th
 April through to Friday 28th April.
 - Evening meal for the nights of Monday 24th, Tuesday 25th and Thursday 27th April including house wine with meal. Wednesday 26th is a free night to enjoy in Inverness.
 - Morning tea/coffee on the five days of competition Monday 24th April through to Friday 28th April. Afternoon tea/coffee on all days except Friday 28th April.
 - On event luggage team to move your luggage from hotel to hotel. Whenever possible, placing your bag in your room ready for your arrival each evening.
- Two souvenir rally plates to fix to front & rear of car
- Two side number panels
- Finishers' awards for each crew member
- Overall awards for 1st, 2nd and 3rd
- Class Awards to third in class if there are three or more crews per class
- Special awards at organisers discretion
- HERO-ERA mechanical assist/sweep teams on event, to help keep crews moving
- An experienced team of HERO-ERA officials & marshals to keep the event moving and on track
- Results team and Media team keeping your family and friends, following the event, up to
- Post event, detailed results book

Article 7.2: Refund of Entry Fees

Cancellation Policy – If cancelled in writing prior to 14th January 2023 (100 days prior) all payments made will be returned apart from the NON-REFUNDABLE deposit of £1,743. If cancelled on or after 14th January 2023 but before 5th March 2023 (50 days prior), then 60% of the entry fee will be retained. An Entry Cancelled on or after 5th March 2023, no refunds or transfer will be possible as 98-100% of the events costs have been paid or committed.

It is suggested that entrants take out their own event cancellation insurance cover.

Article 11.1: Route Description

The total distance of the event will be approximately 950 miles, and the entire the event takes place on tarred roads apart from sections which may be on private land utilising both surfaced and smooth gravel surfaces. On each leg there will be regularity sections, special tests. The special tests will be on private land.

Article 11.2: Route Book and Other Instructions

A detailed route book will be produced which will allow you to complete the route from start to finish.

Article 11.3: Maps

Maps are not required; a set of maps will be included in each day's route book and these will provide an overview of the route for the day.

Article 17.2: Regularity Start Controls

Failure to visit a Manned or Allocated Regularity Start Control:

Amended: Remove 2½ mins, Add 1 min.

Failure to write in a start time in ink at a Self-Start Regularity Start Control or to start at the recorded time:

Amended: Remove 1 min, Add 30 secs.

Article 17.3: Timing Points (TP)

The Joker system will be used on this event.

Article 18.2: Timed Tests

For all of the following, the penalty will be reduced from 30 secs to 15 secs:

Exceeding test maximum including added time penalties

Entering an out-of-bounds area

Wrong Test

Article 26: Insurance

The Organisers have applied for a Blanket Certificate of Insurance to provide competitors who wish to use the scheme with third party cover to meet Road Traffic Act requirements on the road sections of the event.

The premium will be confirmed in 2023. This premium should be fully paid in cleared funds prior to the start of the event.

All competitors who will be driving on the event will be asked to sign an insurance declaration that they have cover for Road Traffic Act requirements, and to confirm that all drivers, either (a) are

covered by an extension to private motor insurance to include cover whilst participating in the event; or (b) are able to comply with the following declaration.

INSURANCE DECLARATION

Vehicles must have Insurance in place which provides as a minimum, Third Party Liability cover that complies with the Road Traffic Act. This can be either, by extending an existing motor policy to cover the event, or, by purchasing additional cover as an adjunct to an existing motor policy.

If a competitor uses an extension to an existing policy, they will be required to sign a declaration that the cover complies with the requirements of the Road Traffic Act. Any responsibility for a fraudulent or misleading declaration about existing cover lies with the competitor.

If a competitor wishes purchase additional cover via the organisers then they can do so prior to the event providing they comply with the following:

Age 19 years or over

Has held a full licence for a minimum of 6 months

Had no more than 6 points on their licence

Had had no more than 1 fault claim in the last 3 years

The vehicle must hold a valid MOT Cert and Road Tax, unless exempt from doing so

Anyone aged less than 19 years old will also be accepted at the same price should their co-driver be a more senior member of their family or over 25.

Any competitor who falls outside these parameters may be offered cover at equivalent terms or an agreed price, if approval from Reis Motorsport Insurance has been obtained by the event organisers, prior to the event.

Additional cover provided by this scheme is only effective whilst the vehicle is actively competing in the event, and remains under the control or direction of the event organiser(s). Cover will cease immediately if you are precluded, excluded or retire from the event.

The Event Organiser's RTA scheme is provided by Reis Motorsport Insurance and underwritten by Markerstudy Insurance Services Limited.
