Article 1.1: Definition and Status

These Additional Supplementary Regulations (ASRs) must be read in conjunction with the 2026 HERO Standard Regulations (HSRs). The article numbers are those of the HSRs. Competitors must study the HSRs as well as these ASRs. (Note: Any amendments to the 2026 HSRs will be advised in Bulletin 1)

The 2026 version of the HSRs will be found on the Event page from January 2026.

HERO Challenge Three will be run by HERO-ERA under a Clubman Historic Road Rally Permit (no. TBA) issued by Motorsport UK and is open only to members of the promoting club in compliance with the Regulations of Motorsport UK in compliance with the FIVA International Sport Code; the HSRs; these ASRs; and further Bulletins for the event, which may amend these ASRs and the HSRs.

HERO Challenge Three Interclub will be run by HERO-ERA under an Interclub Status Historic Road Rally Permit (no. TBA) issued by Motorsport UK

The Interclub Rally will be a round of the 2026 HRCR Clubman's Road Rally Championship and is open to all members of the organising club or registered contenders in the 2026 HRCR Clubman's Road Rally Championship.

IMPORTANT NOTE: All motor sport is potentially dangerous. The onus is on competitors to drive carefully and safely at all times. The Organisers accept no responsibility whatsoever for any accident or injury befalling competitors, and do not undertake to provide rescue or assistance of any kind. All competitors will be required to sign the indemnity at Signing On.

Please note that in some cases it will be necessary for us to apply for waivers if your car is of a type registered after 1st January 1974. (Assuming the amendments to the Motorsport Regulations as proposed are adopted)

The organisers reserve the right to amalgamate or split classes as appropriate based on the entries received.

Master: A crew where any member has had four or more finishes in the top 10 places overall of a National B, Interclub or higher status rally in the role in which they have entered, in the last 4 years.

Expert: A crew which does not qualify as a master, or novice in the role of which they have entered.

Novice: A crew in which no member has had four or more finishes in the top 25 places overall of a National B, Interclub or higher status rally in the role in which they have entered, in the last 4 years.

Article 5.2 – Eligible Competitors – Licences

All crew members must produce a valid 2026 Motorsport UK Competition Licence (minimum RS Interclub) and club membership card at signing on.

Article 6.1: Entry Applications

Entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis to those competitors who have completed the entry form in full and paid the deposit. If full payment isn't received by the closing date then the place will be offered to the first reserve on the waiting list.

All participants must be a registered contender in the HRCR Clubman Championship or a HERO ERA Member.

The closing date for entries is Friday 4th September 2026

Article 6.2: Maximum and Minimum Number of Entries

The maximum number of entries allowed to take part will be 40, the minimum will be 25.

Article 7.1: Entry Fees

The entry fee includes:

Article 7.2: Refund of Entry Fees

Cancellation Policy – If cancelled in writing prior to 21st August (28 days prior), all payments made will be returned less an admin fee of £35. If cancelled in writing between 21st August and 4th September (14 days prior), the full fee will be retained but wherever possible we will allocate part of the entry fee to a future event, less an admin fee of £35. After 4th September, no refunds or transfer will be possible as 98% of the events costs have been paid or committed.

We suggest that you consider arranging your own event cancellation insurance cover.

Article 11.1: Route Description

The total distance of the event will be approximately 170 miles, the majority of which takes place on tarred roads apart from sections which may be on private land utilising both surfaced and smooth gravel surfaces. There will be regularity sections and special tests. The special tests will be on private land.

Navigation will follow the recommended HRCR styles. A route book will be provided giving details of the link sections, rest halts and diagrams for the special Tests. Navigation for the regularity sections will be given out at appropriate times/controls, further information as to where and in what format will be provided in the Final Instructions. It is the competitor's responsibility to provide speed tables.

Article 11.3: Maps

The Interclub event is intending to use O.S. Landranger Series 1:50,000 scale maps 100,101,105,106 latest editions.

Article 26: Insurance

The Organisers have elected not to offer a Blanket Certificate of Insurance to provide competitors with third party cover to meet Road Traffic Act requirements on the road, therefore all competitors will need to ensure they have the correct insurance for rallying on the public highway in compliance with the road traffic act and sign a declaration stating that, at signing on.
